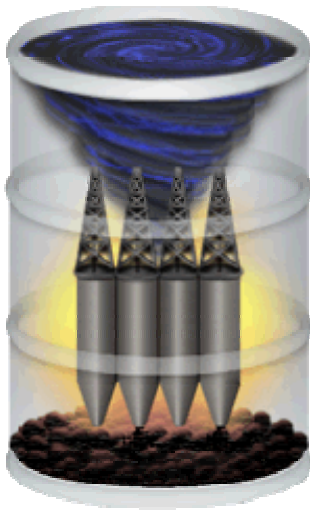
DETAILS
